It highlights prevention education that is done by the Meridian Police Department SRO Team, Crime Prevention and MADC/Drug Prevention. The Meridian Police Department facilitated 504 prevention events and trainings throughout the year, reaching 43,969 community members. <i>MADC/Drug Prevention engaged with students and community members at 63 events and trainings throughout the year reaching 26,054 community members.</i> This matches our pre-COVID numbers and shows we have sustained our partnerships and service to the community during the last couple years.
